Public Works

- Projects
 - The City now owns all of the land in the LC-17 project. Bexar County will continue to maintain the area for the next year and will provide support for the remaining four years of FEMA mitigation efforts. Bexar County contracted with JMI Contracting and they are now in charge of the entire site and will be planting trees and maintaining the land.
 - Garren Construction continues this week with the remodel of the Community Center. The contractor will be installing the grease interceptor, flooring, and kitchen equipment this week.
 - The contractor for the Grass Hill Elevated Tank Rehabilitation Project continues their work and will now install the city logo and lighting.
 - Engineering and design work continues on the Seneca West Drainage Project. The proposed alignment was sent to the San Antonio River Authority (SARA) for their approval.
 - The Year 4 Street Maintenance Project will be advertised for bids shortly. Once they have been received, verified, and tabulated, the item will go to City Council for bid award.

- Staff is working on a submittal for an Alamo Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) reimbursement grant to hopefully construct the second portion of the Huebner Greenway Trail, from Bandera Road to Evers Road.
- The City was awarded a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) in the amount of \$318,960 for the Settlers Ridge and Blacksmith Water and Sewer Main Replacement Project. The staff has prepared the item for City Council review for the March 9th City Council meeting.
- Staff is working on plans and design for a proposed new Public Works facility, new library annex, and remodeled pool facilities.
- Staff is working on the budget for FY 2021-22.
- The Crew is continuing to replace the trail at the Silo Park. The old road millings have been removed and base material added. They have repaired all low areas and new asphalt is being installed.
- The Crew repaired sidewalks along Autumn Chase.
- The Crew repaired potholes on Grass Valley and Seneca.
- The Crew is building ADA ramp in the City Hall annex.
- The Crew will be building a concrete pad for the storage unit at the Fire Department.
- The Crew is performing trash removal and clean up at the parks, repairing broken water lines at Park restrooms.
- The Crew is remodeling new building at 6401 El Verde. We are calling this building the City Hall Annex. The roofers will be there this week to replace the roof.
- The Crew assisted with water giveaway at Community Center.
- The Crew removed graffiti from the Silos.
- The Crew is continuing to sweep up sand on all city streets that were sanded due to the ice storm.
- The Crew is cleaning out meter boxes in the Linkwood subdivision.
- The Crew is replacing curb stops in various places due to the ice storm.
- The Crew is repairing damages to Huebner well site from the ice storm.
- The Staff is Recalculating water bills due to ice storm.
- The Crew is repairing a vacuum truck.
- The Crew is re-tapping the lateral line on Stirrup from the weekend main break.
- Meetings
 - Assistant Director is attending monthly Technical Advisory Committee meetings for the Alamo Area Metropolitan Planning Organization and attended Regional Water Resource Development Group (RWRDG) meeting.
 - Staff is attending workshops on the Bandera Road redevelopment concepts.
 - The Earthwise Living Day Committee has received a Proclamation to declare the month of March as Earthwise Living Month. Various activities will be posted on our website and social media, and a tree giveaway will be held on Saturday, March 27, from 9:00 am to noon at the Community/Conference Center grounds.
 - The Director will be receiving training as the Local Government Projects Manager from TxDOT.

The Fire Department also assisted residents that lost power and needed medical oxygen during that time.
- The Fire Department also assisted with several apartment complex residents with collapsed ceilings associated with water leaks. The Red Cross was called for those families that did not have another place to go.
- Fire Department staffing was increased by 33% during this time to assist with the increased call volume.
