Public Works

- Projects:
 - The contractor for the LC-17 Flood Project is currently working on the gabion erosion control devices at the Huebner Onion Natural Area Park near the Bandera Road bridge. El Verde Road received an asphalt overlay and it looks and drives much better. The contractor will be performing a walk through with City Staff later this week on the El Verde Road portion of the project. They continue to haul off the soils stockpile and continue the creek grading, seeding & planting. Substantial completion is expected in mid-August, weather permitting.
 - Staff will be meeting with the contractor for the FY 2020 Street Maintenance Project for preconstruction instruction. Once the contracts are signed, we will proceed with a start date. The scope of work for this project consists of the milling and overlay of Larksong, Wagon Spoke, and Blacksmith; applying a single bituminous slurry seal to Sunlight, Desert Sun, Sun Hollow, Sun Creek, Sun Dial, Setting Sun, Sunview, Evening Sun, Bluebird, Lobo Ln., Thunderbird, Stebbins, Redbird, Britannia Ct., Edinborough; and providing sidewalk ramp improvements to 33 ADA ramps. In addition, they will perform the milling and overlay of Balky St., Hoofs, Poss Rd. (from Evers to Trotter), Trotter, and providing sidewalk ramp improvements to 18 ADA ramps in that area.
 - The new crosswalk project is almost complete. The new crosswalks are located at Poss and Peachtree, and on Huebner at the elementary school and at Balky. The contractor has started on the punch list and should be complete by the end of this week.
 - The City will be receiving \$1,346,000 from Bexar County to complete a flood remediation project in the Seneca West area. Surveying and engineering have been completed, and plans are being developed.
 - The City Engineer has prepared an irrigation and planting plan for the vacant lot at Peachtree and Poss. We have received the quotes for this work and have asked the contractors to resubmit quotes, as they left out some work items.
 - o The HALT flood gates along Evers and Poss Roads are completed. The County will now perform testing to make sure it's fully operational. Once completed, the County will do a final test with our Fire Department personnel to simulate flooding, to make sure the lights come on, the gates are activated, and proper status is displayed on the Website. The contractor will show us how to look at the data through the software. These new gates will flash, open, and close on their own as they sense floodwaters rising.
 - The City Engineer/Architect prepared plans and specifications for the Community Center remodel. The bids have been advertised and opened on July 14th.
 - o Staff and the City Engineer are working on rewrites to the subdivision code.
 - We repaired the sidewalk along Charles Field Rd.
 - The Crew started work on the concrete foundation for the butterfly pavilion at Raymond Rimkus Park.
 - The Crew will begin crack sealing next week in Sun Valley and Monte Robles Park in preparation for the street maintenance project sealcoat.
 - We disinfected all playgrounds, restrooms, outdoor fitness equipment at all parks.
 - We Performed sign inventory city-wide to replace faded or damaged signage.
 - o Mowed and trimmed in Mow Zone 3 (Sawyer Road, Old Mill drainage area).
 - We trimmed up the trees along the Evers Road pool frontage.
 - A Subcontractor will be installing a new fence in Raymond Rimkus Park this week. A tree fell
 on the fence behind Sunlight Drive.
 - We Took and submitted residential water samples.
 - We are working with John Marshall High School to install new meters for their new construction projects.

• Community Service

- O The Leon Valley Police Department continues to work with the Leon Valley Senior Center leadership to provide assistance to local seniors. Over the last few weeks our officers have picked up medicine and food, changed light bulbs, removed hazardous waste, and attended to several other needs of our citizens. This free service will continue as long as needed.
- The Leon Valley Police Department has teamed up with Meals on Wheels to identify those in need from the Leon Valley area. The program administers aide to 40 people within Leon Valley, delivering food and groceries on a regular basis. The police department has taken over that responsibility for Meals and Wheels, and we have reached out to all of the residents to let them know to call us directly if we can be of assistance.
- o The Leon Valley Police Department has been actively reaching out to business owners that are open to see what we can do to help. We continue to maintain an open dialogue with them on their needs, as well as keeping them updated on the changes due to the new/updated Corona Virus executive orders at the local, county and state levels.

• Training

- o All officers continue to update their CJIS training as required by State law.
- o Four officers attended a 2-day Less-Lethal training class.

Fire Department

- The Fire Department has received several donations to the blessing box over the last two weeks. We are currently working with Maribel to find an additional resource that may need the extra items we have collected.
- Project Cool is in full swing. Four more fans were donated to the department and they will be dispersed to citizens in need.
- Captain Wade Clapper, Captain Jimmy Garcia, Lieutenant John Suhr, and Firefighter Jason Prado have successfully completed their Driver Operator certification course and are now eligible to test for their Texas Commission on Fire Protection state certification.
- Fire Marshals patrolled for fireworks on the 4th of July from 8pm to 2am. They responded to 5 calls for service for fireworks and made contact at 14 separate locations for firework violations. No citations were written due to compliance and only a single visit was required at each residence.
- Serve Pro Braun Station donated their time and equipment to the City to decontaminate all Fire Department, Police Department, and Public Works vehicles.
