Public Works

- Projects:
 - The contractor for the LC-17 Flood Project is currently working on the gabion erosion control devices at the Huebner Onion Natural Area Park near the Bandera Road bridge. El Verde Road received an asphalt overlay and it looks and drives much better. The contractor will be performing work noted in the walkthrough performed two weeks ago on the El Verde Road portion of the project. They continue to haul off the soils stockpile and continue the creek grading, seeding & planting. Substantial completion is expected in mid-August, weather permitting.
 - Staff will be meeting with the contractor for the FY 2020 Street Maintenance Project for a preconstruction meeting on Tuesday, July 28th. Once the contracts are signed, we will proceed with a start date.
 - The new crosswalk project is almost complete. The new crosswalks are located at Poss and Peachtree, and on Huebner at the elementary school and at Balky. The contractor has started on the punch list and should be complete by the end of this week.
 - The City will be receiving \$1,346,000 from Bexar County to complete a flood remediation project in the Seneca West area. Surveying and engineering have been completed, and plans are being developed.
 - O The City Engineer has prepared an irrigation and planting plan for the vacant lot at Peachtree and Poss. We have received the quotes for this work and have asked the contractors to resubmit quotes, as they left out some work items. Tiger has graciously agreed to provide all the plantings at no cost to the City.
 - The HALT flood gates along Evers and Poss Roads are completed. The County will now perform testing to make sure it's fully operational. Once completed, the County will do a final test with our Fire Department personnel to simulate flooding, to make sure the lights come on, the gates are activated, and proper status is displayed on the website. The contractor will show us how to look at the data through the software. These new gates will flash, open, and close on their own as they sense floodwaters rising.
 - The City Engineer/Architect prepared plans and specifications for the Community Center remodel. The bids have been opened, but the project may have to be rebid due to some errors in the bid document and an error on the part of one bidder.
 - o Staff and the City Engineer are working on rewrites to the sub-division code.
 - o The Crew finished the concrete foundation for the butterfly pavilion at Raymond Rimkus Park and the Maintenance Crew completed the building of the pavilion.
 - The Crew will begin crack sealing next week in Sun Valley and Monte Robles Park in preparation for the street maintenance project seal coat.
 - The Crew is making repairs to the asphalt walking path at the Old Mill Park and will prepare the trail for an asphalt overlay.
 - o Disinfected all playgrounds, restrooms, outdoor fitness equipment at all parks.
 - Completed moving and trimming in Mow Zone 3 (Sawyer Road, Old Mill drainage area).
 Moving to Zone 1 this week.
 - o The Crew trimmed up the trees along the Evers Road pool frontage.
 - We took care of OnIt reports regarding Graffiti in Rimkus Park.
 - We assisted the apartments at Shadow Mist with isolating a main valve.
 - We repaired a main break over the weekend at 6821 Bandera Rd.
 - We continued clearing a blocked sewer main located in the Seneca Creek easement and preparing for a video to determine if the main needs replacing.

- We issued hangtags and performing disconnects of water service due to nonpayment.
- We worked with John Marshall High School to install new meters for their new construction projects.

o Maintenance Crew Foreman Michael Tristan took the class to become a Licensed Irrigation Technician and is now waiting to receive the approval to take the test.

• Community Service

- O The Leon Valley Police Department continues to work with the Leon Valley Senior Center leadership to provide assistance to local seniors.
