Public Works

Projects:

- The LC-17 Flood Project is still pretty saturated, and the contractor has not been able to make great progress. Because they are at final grade in the creek bed, they cannot track machines down into the creek without damaging the integrity of the grade. They plan on repairing El Verde Road and removing the dirt pile from Shadow Mist Park during the next two weeks, weather permitting. Due to the rains, their new completion date is April of 2020.
- Ocity Crews are continuing to construct the concrete roadway on El Verde Road in front of the fire station. They are preparing the roadway to pour the third section this week. Two long sections have been completed. The remaining work is expected to take 2-4 weeks, depending on weather and concrete curing times.
- o Staff is preparing policies and procedures to reduce energy usage at city facilities.
- o The streets for the FY 2020 Street Maintenance Project have been chosen, and bid documents are being prepared.
- The bids for the rehabilitation of the Grass Hill elevated tank rehabilitation project were opened and Staff will be recommending the rejection of bids received at the City Council meeting of March 17, 2020.
- o Bids for the new crosswalks along Huebner and Poss Roads were opened and will be presented to the City Council for approval on March 17, 2020.
- The City will be receiving \$1,346,000 from Bexar County to complete a flood remediation project in the Seneca West area. Surveying and engineering have begun.
- Staff has finalized water and sewer main replacement plans and is consulting with our rate consultant on how to pay for these needed improvements. We expect to take these findings to a City Council meeting in July.
- We are preparing a Bexar County CDBG grant request to replace water and sewer mains on Settler's Ridge. The application is due on April 9, 2020.
- o The City Engineer is preparing an irrigation plan for the plantings at Peachtree and Poss.
- The sidewalk contractor is working on constructing the sidewalk from Canterfield to the Silo Park. They will then construct the sidewalk on Evers near Seneca.
- o Bexar County is installing HALT flood gates along Evers and Poss Roads this week. These new gates will flash, open, and close on their own as they sense floodwaters rising.
- o Staff is preparing draft budgets for the FY 20-21 fiscal year.
- o Clearing out the Linkwood Trail and trimming up the trees.
- Placing the Huebner well back in service this week and cleaning up well site from construction debris.

Fire Department

- Mandatory Annual Physical Agility Test All Firefighters are required to complete a Physical Agility Test annually and is part of the wellness program, which includes annual physical exams, and additional resources. The Physical Agility Test is a measure to reduce the risk of injury or death through the identification of job performance abilities and physical fitness. Also used as a pathway towards improvement in ability and safety. The Physical Agility Test consists of a pass/fail timed test with a time limit of 20 minutes as well as a test score based on a 100-point scale.
- Mandatory Annual SCBA Mask Testing (service progression and community service) The SCBA Mask, a self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA) plays a big role in protecting the health of firefighters and to ensure safety equipment is safe. This device is worn by firefighters to provide compressed air in an immediately dangerous to life or health atmosphere. The SCBA is used when longer-duration of supply breathing gas is needed. Using SCBA drills to improve air management for operational readiness is crucial as their life depends on how well the device functions; therefore, it's

- maintained for personal safety daily. This testing meets guidelines established by the National Fire Protection Association, NFPA Standard 1981.
- Emergicon (EMS cost recovery services) The Emergicon collection for February 2020 is in the amount of \$25,682.47, with a 33% collection rate.
- **Fire Recovery USA Program (Accident cost recovery services)** Our Accident Cost Recovery collection for the month of February 2020 is in the amount of **\$2,121.10**.
- **Heroes for Health!** (community service) The Fire Department, Captain Garcia, presented a Health, Exercise, and Healthy Foods on Thursday, February 27th for the students at Oak Hills Terrace Elementary. This program provides education regarding the importance of drinking 5-7 cups per day, consuming two servings of fruit, three servings of vegetables, eating breakfast as well as exercise with examples of physical activities to do every day. Overall, the goal is to prevent the risk of health problems and heart disease. Please see our pictures on our Facebook page.
- 31st Annual Earthwise Living Day (community service) The Leon Valley Fire Department participates annually, providing Flood Prevention Emergency Plan Magnets (associated FERP-Flood Emergency Response Plan), File of Life's, Firewise safety, Daylight Savings! Change your clock, change your smoke and carbon monoxide alarms, Fall Prevention (elderly), Flood, FEMA Prepare. Emergency list Plan. Stay Informed, car seat information, Fire prevention Look, Listen & Learn information as well as for the children firefighter hats, stickers, rulers, cold packs, and key chains.
- Flood Emergency Plan Magnets (associated FERP-Flood Emergency Response Plan) We distributed Flood Magnets at the City Council Meeting on February 19th, 2019 to City Council and LV residents. The Fire Dept will be distributing Flood Magnets (w/Red Cross shelter emergency map/information and contact numbers), delivering door to door in the flood plain housing areas in March. We have posted on our social media pages (Facebook & Next door), we will be distributed at community events such as Earthwise Day, Arbor Day, and the 4th of July Celebration. The Flood Magnets are available at the Fire Dept, Police Dept, City Hall (City Council table, literature rack) as well as the Library. We have notified Tracy Beach, American Red Cross, Disaster Program Manager regarding Leon Valley's proactive FERP-Flood Emergency Response Plan initiatives, as well as the Flood Magnet for their records. We thanked the American Red Cross for partnering with us. Per Ms. Beach, "Appreciate all you all do to prepare your community!".
- **File of Life** We reordered the "File of Life" Emergency Information Refrigerator Magnet Cards for citizens for their home at No Cost. The card is filled out by the citizens and contains important medical and contact information that the EMS staff needs to know during an emergency, such as medical history, allergies, and medications. A File of Life is part of our **"Prevention Program"** the information is kept on the home refrigerator for easy access for EMS crews. Please pick up your "File of Life" at the Fire Department, Library, or City Hall.
- Census 2020 is almost Here! March 12-20, (community service) Every 10 years! The Census is a count of people who live in America; this includes children and babies in your household. It allocates 1.5 Trillion dollars every year based solely on the numbers collected this year. These dollars go towards our community for Education, Hospitals & Healthcare, Public Safety, Roads, and Transportation. The solution is to answer the Census. Be Counted!
