## **Public Works**

- Projects:
  - The contractor for the LC-17 is at 70% poured on channel # 2 (behind homes), and they are grading the creek channel, installing topsoil on slopes, they have one more sewer lateral to install, and are starting on their punch list items.
  - Blacksmith Lane & Wagon Spoke Sewer/Water Main Replacement contractor is underway and moving fast.

- Evers at Seneca Sidewalk Extension Project starts mid-August. Forest Meadow Drainage Improvements – Raymond Rimkus Park – approved by Council on August 6th and we are waiting on contracts before commencing project.
- o Leon Valley Street Maintenance Year 2 starts mid-August.
- Staff is finalizing the designs for the custom art proposed for the bus shelters at the library and the park.
- O Bexar County Flood Control will be performing a mill & overlay of El Verde Road, once the LC-17 construction has been completed. They will also realign the drainage swales on the sides of El Verde Road so that proper drainage of the street is restored. Shortly after that, the City will install a replacement water main.
- Preparing to enhance the crosswalk on Evers in front of the library. Thermoplastic signs will be
  placed in the street in both directions, rumble strips will be installed, and signage will be placed
  farther away from the crosswalk. The work will begin on August 23, 2019.
   Shade structures for the large playground at Raymond Rimkus Park are expected to be installed
  by the end of August.
- The Texas Water Development Board (TWDB) recently announced new grant opportunities that were passed at this past legislative session. Come November, voters will be asked to vote for or against a constitutional amendment to create a Flood Infrastructure Fund (FIF). This new fund would provide low-cost loans and grants for drainage, flood mitigation, and flood control projects. The money would come from the Economic Stabilization Fund (also known as the Rainy Day Fund). In addition, the TWDB will be creating a state flood plan, to be adopted in 2024, and implementing two new funds the aforementioned FIF and the Texas Infrastructure Resiliency Fund (TIRF). Staff was proposing to bring our flooding concerns to the City Council and asking that funding to mitigate Leon Valley flooding be placed on the ballot in November for citizen vote, but we are now advocating for waiting to see if the state wide measure is approved. If it is, we could qualify for these grants and low cost loans and maybe not have to solicit bonds or Certificates of Obligation.
- o Finishing up the pavilion. Benches will be installed around the pathway and the equipment, then trash/recycling containers will be delivered.
- Repairing the walking path at Old Mill Park the recycled millings are falling apart. Also
  installing trash/recycling kiosks.
- o Repairing potholes on Blackberry Road.
- o Mowing in Mow Zone 3 (Grissom/Sawyer/Diecker Route).
- o Repaired fence at Old Mill Park.
- o Installing no cell phone signs along Bandera Road.
- o Rehabilitating the softball field at Raymond Rimkus Park.
- o Installed new signage at The Ridge at Leon Valley Park.
- Assisted Water Crew with repairing two water main breaks.
- Repaired two water main breaks over the weekend no rain has the soil shifting and old mains breaking.
- o Repairing water leaks at Raymond Rimkus Park.
- o Preparing for annual backflow inspections.
- o Creating water and sewer main replacement plan.
- Waiting on delivery of the new flatbed truck should be delivered by mid-August.
- The Maintenance Crew Leader is studying to become a Certified Playground Inspector and a Certified Pool Operator and will take the tests in August.
- o Crew member will be taking Pest Control classes in order to obtain the license.
- New Crewmember will be studying for an herbicide application class and testing, as a part of the new street sweeping program.

He previously served as the Deputy Fire Marshal for the Bexar County Fire Marshal office. Captain Garcia has 19+ plus years in the fire service industry and has already been a great addition to our team by way of hitting the ground running completing business inspections. Additional experience consists of Peace Officer, Master Fire Fighter Certification, Arson Investigator, Inspector of Plans Examiner, Instructor II, Bachelor's Degree in Fire and Emergency Service Administration. As Captain, he will be engaged with Deputy Fire Marshal responsibilities such as inspections, prevention and investigative tasks within the City. In addition to promoting fire education programs and conducts fire safety inspections controls and extinguishes fires, performs rescue, protects life and property, administers emergency medical care and transport; and does related work as required. We are excited and we look forward to our Fire Department leadership progressive initiative. Please help us in welcoming Captain Garcia!
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Soap Box Derby (community service) The Fire Department, Chief Naughton and Ms. Martin are assisting Maribel Mendoza with the planning of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Soap Box Derby event that will be held on October 12<sup>th</sup> at 8:30 a.m. located on Evers at Poss. Road. We are requesting soap box derby drivers and back-up drivers from the elementary schools. We will have food vendors, music, and an award ceremony. We have posted this information on social media, so please help us get the word out. Please Share. We hope everyone will participate!
- Fire Recovery USA (cost recovery for car accidents) In February 2018, the Fire Department implemented the Fire Recovery USA collection recovery cost program. The purpose of this service is to assist with FD recovery of funds from services provided while responding to vehicle accidents (i.e. Scene Assessment & Stabilization, Apparatus on scene, Personnel on scene, Traffic Control). This comprises of extracting billing information and narratives from our electronic incident reporting system, and then billing the insurance company for the emergency responses. We have achieved a total collection in the amount of \$40,426.21 to date with a Recovery Collection Rate of 95%! Additional statistics; 104 archived claims, 53 active runs (pending awaiting insurance approval), 4 denials (by insurance companies) and 2 non-billable (due to insufficient information). Our team will continue to monitor our successful collection.
- **Emergicon EMS Billing (EMS)** The EMS collection for the month of July 2019 was in the amount of \$36,895.48.
- Southwest Texas Regional Advisory Council Meeting (EMS continuing education and leadership)
   Captain Wade Clapper attended the STRAC Meeting held at Uvalde County Fair plex on August 2,
  2019 9am to 2pm. The STRAC meeting is an opportunity for EMS leaders and practitioners to converse

  available.
