Public Works

- Projects:
 - The contractor for the LC-17 project is working on completing the work on El Verde Street, preparing Channel 2 for concrete (rain out), completing the drainage way behind El Verde, and has completed the concrete head wall at Channel 1. They are still pumping out excess water from the site. The project's projected end date is now in July, due to the recent rains, with 30 days allotted for punch-list completion.
 - NG Painting has completed the welding work on the Grass Hill above ground water storage tank and will now be applying the exterior coating, weather permitting. We expect the project to be completed by mid-May.

- The City Engineer has finalized plans for the bio-swale to be installed at Raymond Rimkus Park Forest Meadow entrance. The project will be bid in May and work is to start right after the 4th of July event. Provisions will be made to keep the entrance open to the Community Gardeners.
- The City Engineer has finalized the documents for the Grass Hill well plant generator. The project will bid next week.
- Staff received bids for concrete pavers for the parking lot at Shadow Mist. The Council final approval of the bid is expected on May 21, 2019.
- The City Engineer is finalizing the Huebner at Balky crosswalk bid documents. The bids will be advertised in May.
- Staff and the City Engineer are revising the MS4 Stormwater Permit Plan to assess fees based on impervious cover instead of land size.
- Staff is meeting with Waterworth software technicians to review water and sewer needs for capital planning purposes. We are in the process of creating an Infrastructure Capital Plan for the water and sewer system to be used for the next 20 years.
- Staff is working on designs for the custom art proposed for the bus shelters at the library and the park.
- Staff is working on a proposal to install electric vehicle charging stations at certain areas in the city. We expect to bring this idea to Council in June.
- O Staff has prepared a rain barrel and xeriscaping rebate program that is expected to be approved by Council on May 21st. The program would give a \$40 water bill credit to people who install rain barrels at their residences and \$100 credit for people who install at least 200 square feet of xeriscaping, replacing the grass.
- Staff has applied for an award from the American Public Works Association for the Evers Road Bridge. Winners are to be announced at the annual conference in Austin in June.
- Year 1 Street Maintenance Project is almost complete. The contractor is working in Shadow Mist and Pavona Place to clean up the overspill from the seal coating.
- The City Engineer is finalizing the plans for the Blacksmith and Wagon Spoke water and sewer main replacement project. We expect to bid this project in May. This is part of a CDBG grant program.
- Staff is working on a cost sharing project with Bexar County to mill and overlay El Verde Road, once the LC-17 construction has been completed.
- o Repaired Evers Road pathway entrance to Raymond Rimkus Park.
- o Repairing curb at Poss and Andres Salazar Roads.
- o Constructing walking path at The Ridge at Leon Valley Park.
- Continuing to cleaning out tributary between William Rancher and Samaritan roads, weather permitting.
- o Continuing construction on pavilion at The Ridge at Leon Valley Park.

• Training

- The Maintenance Crew Leader is studying to become a Certified Playground Inspector and a Certified Pool Operator.

Fire Department

- SCBA-Air Management for Operational Readiness Drills (training) -We recently purchased new Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus's (SCBA) this device is worn by firefighters to provide compressed air in an immediately dangerous to life or health atmosphere. The SCBA is used when longer-duration of supply breathing gas is needed. The team is getting acclimated with their new devices and conducting air consumption drills daily. Using SCBA drills to improve air management for operational readiness is crucial as their life depends on how well the device functions; therefore, it's maintained for personal safety on a daily basis. All of the following meet guidelines established by the National Fire Protection Association, NFPA Standard 1981.
- Canada Tower Climb (community service abroad) The 5th Annual Firefighter Stair climb Challenge in support of Wellspring Calgary. On Sunday, May 5, 2019, Deputy Fire Marshal Eric Burnside along with hundreds of firefighters from across North America and the world will climb the stairs of Calgary's BOW tower, one of Western Canada's tallest buildings, in support of firefighters and citizens living with cancer. Calgary is poised to cheer on the brave ones who will climb the 775 vertical feet 1204 steps of The BOW Building in full duty gear. Starting at 3400 feet above sea level, this climb is the highest elevation firefighter stair climb in the world! This event was created to raise funds for firefighters and other citizens who are battling cancer. Eric was one of 5 international participants to attend the event. Other international attendees included an additional participant from Texas, 2 participants from California, 1 participant from Washington, and a participant from Australia. The participants for the climb raised over \$393,000.
- **Fire Recovery USA Cost Recovery** The Fire department has received an incident recovery total collection in the amount of \$37,105.39 to date with 47 active runs, and 4 denials by insurance companies.
- School of Science & Technology "The EDDY-2019 SST Education Awards" (community service) This was an award and scholarship ceremony sponsored by Building Hope; VBM; Heritage Center Development; PNC Bank; Case Development; BB&T; Schumann Lopez Hoffer and Adelstein Lase Firm; and Wells Nelson and Associates. These organizations support a quality education for all children. SST received \$42,000 from benefactors and the SST 2019 Advocate of the Year is Captain Clarence Franklin, Commanding Officer Navy Information Operations Command. Community Development Department

- Zoning Commission
 - The Zoning Commission held a special meeting on Tuesday, May 14, 2019, to receive feedback from the Zoning Commission regarding a potential new residential development on the 3 acre parcel generally located at 6758 Poss Road. At the meeting, the Commission considered different residential development type options including townhouse and apartments.
 - The next regular Zoning Commission meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, May 28, 2019. The following items are scheduled for consideration:
 - A zone change to remove the Sustainability Overlay District classification at 6617 Evers Road. Reconsideration from March 26th meeting.
 - A specific use permit for a self-service car wash and auto detailing at 6617 Evers Road.
 Reconsideration from March 26th meeting.
 - A Specific Use Permit for a Kennel at 6703 Poss Road.
 - A specific Use Permit for outside storage at 6200 Grissom Road.
 - Zoning Code Amendment Regarding requirements for Community Homes.
- Board of Adjustment
 - Staff has received a request for a variance at 6617 Evers Road. This request is currently on hold pending the outcome of the associated zone change and SUP for this property.
 - o The Board of Adjustment held a meeting on Thursday, April 18, 2019, in order to hold an executive session to discuss pending litigation.
 - The Board of Adjustment will also be holding an additional meeting in May to provide continuing education and training focusing on the recently revised procedures and criteria for evaluating variance requests.

Plats

- Staff has an open replat request by Huebner Dirt Investments Ltd. for 2.418 acres located on Huebner Road. The replat would potentially create 3 lots. The land is undeveloped and is currently zoned B-1 and B-2. The applicant plans to request a rezoning of the property and has postponed his plat application until that time. An SUP will also be required for new commercial development on the site because it is adjacent to residential zoning.
- Staff has received a replat of the property currently occupied by John Marshall High School. The purpose of the replat is to remove an existing easement that will facilitate the reconstruction of their library.

Development Meetings

Staff has had preliminary development meetings with the owners of 6758 Poss Road, regarding a potential new residential development on that property. As a result of those meetings, Staff finds it necessary for the owners to make a preliminary presentation to the Zoning Commission to bring the Commission up to speed on the project, and for the Commission to provide the owners and Staff direction moving forward.
