#### **Public Works**

#### • Projects:

- The LC-17 crew is waiting for the creek to dry up before continuing. They will be working on the roadway and in the creek.
- Leon Valley Street Maintenance Year 2 we will be performing a walk through this week and preparing a punchlist for corrections.
- Staff is still waiting on approval from VIA for the library and park bus shelter artwork. Once received, it is to be installed.
- o City Crews have started the concrete project on El Verde Road in front of the fire station. Work is expected to take 6 − 8 weeks, depending on weather and concrete curing times.
- Staff will be forwarding some documents to Directors from CPS Energy and ClearResult to identify ways the City can reduce their energy usage at city facilities. Tentative meeting date is 11/24 to go over the results and create an energy reduction plan.
- o Bexar County is moving forward with the installation of flood gates along Poss and Evers. They expect to install them this month.
- Staff has contacted construction and landscaping companies for the remodel of the restrooms at the Leon Valley Community Pool and installation of landscaping in the adjacent vacant lot. We will be presenting the information to City Council on November 19<sup>th</sup>.
- The Grass Hill generator and Forest Meadow drainage improvements projects have started. The
  Forest Meadow entrance to the park is limited, as this area is in the work zone. Community
  Gardeners will be able to tend to their plots while the work is in progress.
- Staff has chosen the streets for the FY 2020 Street Maintenance Project, based on their ranking.
   The City Engineer will now prepare the plans and bid specifications.
- The engineer has begun preparing bid documents for the Grass Hill elevated tank rehabilitation project.
- o Plans for ADA sidewalk extensions across the alleys in Linkwood are being developed.
- Staff has ordered the new Capital items for the park, which include new picnic tables, shade structures, an outdoor fitness station for the Linkwood Trail, and a new pavilion for the new walking path at Raymond Rimkus Park.
- Staff is finalizing water and sewer main replacement plans and will consult with our rate consultant on how to pay for these much needed improvements.
- o Continuing to remove asphalt on El Verde Road for concrete in front of the fire station.
- o Installing holiday lighting and decorations at all facilities in preparation for the Holiday Lighting Ceremony and other December holiday activities.

- o Sending more employees to pesticide training in December.
