Public Works

- Projects:
 - o The LC-17 crew is forming on Channel # 2 for concrete pouring.
 - o Blacksmith Lane & Wagon Spoke Sewer/Water Main Replacement contractor has completed the work and we will perform a walk through with them today, before issuing the final check.
 - Leon Valley Street Maintenance Year 2 the company is continuing with the ADA sidewalk ramp construction and will then seal coat Forest Meadow.

- Staff sent the bus shelter designs to VIA for their final approval. Once received, the bus shelter artwork will be installed.
- Bexar County Flood Control will be performing a mill & overlay of El Verde Road, once the LC-17 construction has been completed. They will also realign the drainage swales on the sides of El Verde Road so that proper drainage of the street is restored.
- Shade structures for the large playground at Raymond Rimkus Park have been installed, with the exception of one. A part was missing from the shipment. The part is expected to be delivered today and they will continue installing the last shade. They will also be backfilling adjacent picnic slabs.
- Staff is working with CPS Energy and ClearResult to identify ways the City can reduce their energy usage at city facilities.
- o SAWS repaired their recycled water main leak and the creek is finally drying out.
- Bexar County is moving forward with the installation of flood gates along Poss and Evers. They
 expect to install them late September or early October.
- Staff is contacting construction and landscaping companies for the remodel of the restrooms at the Leon Valley Community Pool and installation of landscaping in the adjacent vacant lot.
- Waiting for Council approval of a budget adjustment Ordinance to start the Grass Hill generator, Forest Meadow drainage improvements, and the Huebner at Balky crosswalk projects.
- Assisting with construction of pavilion at The Ridge at Leon Valley Park.
- o Repairing sidewalk along Crownpiece.
- o Filling pothole on Timco.
- O Performing walk through with electrical contractor for possible maintenance agreement to provide yearly maintenance of electrical systems at each city facility.
- Replacing broken water meters city-wide.
- o Replaced broken sprinkler heads at city facilities.
- o Replacing broken curbstops city-wide.
- o Performing Preventative Maintenance on all Public Works vehicles and equipment.

Community Development Department

- Zoning Code/Comprehensive Plan Revisions
 - The Zoning Commission held meetings in September and October to discuss revisions to the City's zoning code. These meetings included discussion on mixed-use and redevelopment, particularly along the Bandera Road Corridor. However, the current comprehensive plan and future land Use plan (which is a component of the Comprehensive Plan) do not go into detail on these topics; particularly on Bandera Road.
 - o The Comprehensive Plan is a policy document, created by the community that guides among many things, the formulation/implementation of zoning. So it's important that discussion regarding mixed-use, redevelopment, and infill also occur at a comprehensive planning and community level first, before the zoning code revision process continues.
 - Future updates and revisions to the City's Comprehensive Master Plan were discussed at the City's Town Hall meeting on January 26, 2019. Among the concerns that Leon Valley Citizens had regarding future development, was economic and neighborhood stability.
 - Staff is in the process of Developing a Request for Proposals for qualified firms to provide assistance to the City in developing necessary updates to the Plan. Among the Comprehensive Planning elements that Staff plans to address in the RFP are, Fiscal Impact Analysis, Future Land Use Planning, and Transportation Planning.

Plats

- Staff has an open replat request by Huebner Dirt Investments Ltd. for 2.418 acres located on Huebner Road. The replat would potentially create 3 lots. The land is undeveloped and is currently zoned B-1 and B-2. The applicant plans to request a rezoning of the property and has postponed his plat application until that time. An SUP will also be required for new commercial development on the site because it is adjacent to residential zoning.
- Staff has received an amending plat request for Linkwood Addition Lots 8 & 9. This purpose of
 this plat is to combine these two lots into one lot in order to facilitate the development of this
 tract which is generally located just south of Bush's Chicken.
