## **Public Works**

- Projects:
  - The water well project is completed and both wells are in service. The Huebner well was experiencing issues with the 4"air relief valve, and the contractor replaced the parts.
  - O Plans are finalized for a new traffic signal system at Wurzbach and Exchange Parkway, and the bid package was advertised. The bid opening was held on 5/1, and the apparent low bid was

- submitted by SAECO Electric and Utility. LNV reviewed the bid packages and finalized their recommendation. The item will be presented to Council on June 5, 2018.
- The Cades Cove water and sewer main replacement project was designed. The CDBG Agreement was presented to City Council and the bid package and plans were advertised. The pre-bid conference was 5/22, and the bid opening was 5/29. The apparent low bid was submitted by Gilbert's Utility and Concrete, Inc. The item will be presented to Council on June 5, 2018.
- Year 1 street maintenance plans have been prepared and bids are to be advertised next month.
- The Evers Road bridge project is underway and the old crossing has been removed. Badeco, the
  utility contractor, returned this week to correct the depth of the gas main at no additional cost to
  the City. The concrete culverts have been set and poured.
- o The Huebner at Evers traffic signal project is 90% complete. The controller box is being tested and is scheduled to be installed this week.
- Meeting with Consultant Nelisa Heddin to finalize options for water rates, in anticipation of brining to City Council on June 19th.
- Applied for the 2018 Bexar County CDBG Grant for Blacksmith Lane and Wagon Spoke Water and Sewer Main Replacement Project. We were notified by Bexar County CDBG that the City of Leon Valley was awarded the grant.
- Will be taking a request for a budget adjustment and parkland dedication for the vacant lots off
  of Grass Hill, William Rancher, Samaritan, and Aids Drive to Council on June 5th for the second
  reading of the ordinance this will increase the amount of land for The Ridge at Leon Valley
  Park to 3.8402 acres and will provide a better connection to the Hetherington Trail.
- Received quotes for the repair of the Forest Oaks pool deck and pump room anticipate construction the first three weeks of the pool being open.
- O Received a Project Management Plan agreement from the United States Corp of Engineers for a Continuing Authorities Project (CAP) feasibility study of Huebner Creek to control flooding and repair bank erosion will take to Council on June 5th to request a budget adjustment in the amount of \$285,000 to pay our 50% portion of the cost. The San Antonio River Authority will pay their 50% upon signing the agreements.
- The playground and other equipment for Old Mill, Silo, and the Ridge parks was delivered last week and is being installed.
- We received the tank inspection report and cost estimate from LNV Engineers for the 750,000 gallon Grass Hill Ground Storage Tank. The estimate for rehab is \$252,013. LNV will work on completing the bid docs and design plans this summer. The rehab will be scheduled for December 2018.
- o City of Leon valley is in Stage 1 water restrictions

- Traffic Unit
  - The Traffic Unit officers were assigned to school zones before and after school and worked on several reported neighborhood speeding/traffic concerns. Traffic officers focused on citizen's complaints to include: Evers Road, Walgreens parking lot, Seneca Plaza, Seneca Road, the Linkwood Subdivision, Forest Oaks Neighborhood, and Timberhill Street. #### Fire Department

• **Training** – Firefighter Angel Hernandez completed his Associates Degree in Emergency Medical Services from San Antonio College. Firefighter Daniel Cano obtained his Fire Officer certification, and

- six (6) Leon Valley Firefighters passed the new Aerial Apparatus Operator exam given by the Texas Commission on Fire Protection.
- Partnership with John Marshall High School John Marshall High School has started an Emergency Medical Technician academic program for students interested in working in emergency services. Students need to have their skills tested by a state certified EMT or Paramedic, and our team was happy to help. We will continue to forge a partnership with this new program and encourage professional development in emergency services.
- Gas main break response Firefighters responded to a gas leak at the Evers bridge construction site on May 29<sup>th</sup>. The crew attempted to stop the leak from a 2-inch gas line that was severed by construction equipment with a special plug, but were unsuccessful. The crew moved to evacuate nearby residents and contact CPS for an emergency repair. As a precaution, the park and intersection were closed, and the crew requested additional mutual aid resources to assist. The gas main valve was uncovered and closed in approximately one hour from the incident, and the repairs made within 3 hours. 15 homes along Poss rd. were affected by interruption in gas service, but later had services restored.
- Stay Upright! The fall prevention program continues to be a success. Most recently, a fall prevention class at the fire station was held that included attendance by 10 senior citizens that live in Leon Valley.
- **Shelter Training** Through a partnership with the Red Cross and NISD, a shelter Drill at John Marshall High School was held on June 9th from 0830-3PM. This drill was held on short notice with coordination from the Red Cross, and taught volunteers how to operate an emergency shelter, and local residents what to expect if having to respond to an emergency shelter.
- **Update on Fire Recovery USA** The department has received payments from Fire Recovery USA, in the amount of \$4.431.42. The fund was created following the adoption of fees associated with response to vehicle accidents. The system is currently reporting over \$30,000 in pending fees billed to various insurance companies, intended to support the response of Leon Valley Fire Department to vehicle accidents.

# **Community Development Department**

- Zoning Code Revisions
  - o Staff and the Zoning Commission continue discussing potential revisions to the City's zoning code. At their May 22<sup>nd</sup> meeting, Staff presented the following comprehensive schedule for the revision process:

■ June 26<sup>th</sup> **Procedures** 

■ July 24<sup>th</sup> **Districts Classifications** 

■ August 28<sup>th</sup> Use Regulations

 September 25<sup>th</sup> **Development Standards** 

October 23<sup>th</sup> Non-Conformance

#### **Zoning Cases**

- o At the May 22nd meeting, the Zoning Commission recommended approval of a request by Jonathan Keller for a Specific Use Permit at 5405 Bandera Road, Suite 117 to allow for Motorcycle sales and service. The request is scheduled for consideration by the City Council at their June 5th meeting.
- The Department has an open Zone Change and Specific Use Permit request for 7317 Huebner Road to facilitate the expansion of the St. John's Baptist Church. The property is currently zoned B-2 (retail) which does not allow for a church. The property is also located next to a residential area, which triggers the need for an (SUP). The applications are currently on-hold, due to the Zoning code requirement to submit a Level 1 Traffic Impact Analysis.

## **Board Of Adjustment**

o At their May 29th meeting, the Board of Adjustment considered a request by Amerigaard Elite located at 5405 Bandera Road, Suite 101, for a variance to the requirements of the Sign Code for maximum allowed Window Signage. The request was denied.

• Staff is currently coordinating with BOA members regarding a potential meeting on either Tuesday, June 12<sup>th</sup> or Thursday, June 14<sup>th</sup>.

#### Plats

O Staff has an open replat request by Huebner Dirt Investments Ltd. for 2.418 acres located on Huebner Road. The replat would potentially create 3 lots. The land is undeveloped and is currently zoned B-1 and B-2. The applicant plans to request a rezoning of the property and has postponed his plat application until that time. An SUP will also be required for new commercial development on the site because it is adjacent to residential zoning.

# City Council

 The City Council is scheduled to consider a request by Jonathan Keller for a Specific Use Permit at 5405 Bandera Road, Suite 117 to allow for Motorcycle sales and service. The request was considered by the Zoning Commission at their May 22 meeting and the Commission recommended approval.

#### ONIT

Staff continues to work with the On-It team to resolve zoning, code enforcement, and certificate
of occupancy issues throughout the City. Staff provides support to Code Enforcement Officers
conducting research, preparing notices of violation, and initiating zoning and variance requests.

# • Permitting And Records

- o 62 walk-in customers were served from May 9, 2018 to May 30, 2018 at the Community Development office.
- o 80 permits were processed or are in progress.
- o 8 Certificates of Occupancy were issued.
- o 6 building permits (new construction, additions, renovations) were issued.
  - 4 Residential; 2 Commercial
- o The majority of permits issued were Contractor Registration and trade permits (MEP).
- Staff received a resubmittal of the construction plans for the expansion of the Crystal Lakes
   Shopping Center project located 5309 Wurzbach Road, and performed a comprehensive review.

## • Development Meetings/Correspondence

- Staff met with the project team for the Crystal Lakes shopping center regarding their most recent project submittal. Issues discussed include permitting procedures (the site was recently subdivided), site plan compliance, landscape compliance, parking compliance, and architectural compliance. Staff provided the project team with comprehensive zoning comments at the meeting and anticipates a resubmittal.
- Staff corresponded with the project architects for the LA Fitness center proposed in the HEB
  Market Place Shopping Center. The owners are planning to demolish and reconstruct the
  western portion of the shopping previously occupied by Old Navy, for the LA Fitness. Staff
  discussed the architectural requirements of the Commercial/Industrial Overlay District.
- Staff coordinated with owners of the Wei-Kee restaurant (previously China Bowl) regarding their new business at this location. Existing signage will have to be brought into compliance prior to issuance of any permits.
- Staff coordinated with Horizon Design (Landscape Architects) regarding the anticipated submittal for development application for a new retail development at Eckhert and Robin Road (at entrance to Joh Marshall High School). They anticipate the submittal of a variance to the City's Tree Preservation requirements.
- Staff will be meeting with the owners of the San Antonio Aquarium regarding a required landscaping plan for their development

# • Development Office

- Staff continues work streamlining the City's development review process for new requests including building permits, certificates of occupancy, plats, and zoning requests. Enhancements underway include:
  - Updating of all permit applications,

- Creation of permit checklists for the use of both applicants and Staff.
- Creation of a deadline schedule to assist customers in planning for the City's development process.
- Enhanced Site Plan Review process, which enables commercial developers and builders to receive initial review and approval of their proposed site plan prior to proceeding with the building design.

# **Economic Development**

- The Economic/Community Development Advisory Group met May 30, 2018, and recommended approval of funding business breakfasts in coordination with UTSA's Small Business Development Department. This will be presented at the June 19, 2018, City Council Meeting.
- The Economic/Community Development Advisory Group will give their annual report to the Leon Valley City Council on June 19<sup>th</sup>, 2018.
- Staff is working with Quik Trip with the permitting process in anticipation of this store opening in October of 2018.
- Staff is working with the owner of the Rios Crystal Mall as they continue to construct an area for a new Dollar Store.
- Staff (led by City Secretary) continues to work on 4<sup>th</sup> of July activities and sponsors.
- Staff is working on developing a marketing sheet to present at the breakfast meetings and other potential opportunities.

## **City Secretary**

- Since the last report, the City Secretary's Office has processed 7 open record requests. Those requests were for: permit information, Red Light Camera items, planning/platting site plans, Staff emails, staff text messages, staff phone records, body cam videos, various historical ordinances, training manuals, oath of office information, and court records
