Public Works

- Projects:
 - O Plans are finalized for a new traffic signal system at Wurzbach and Exchange Parkway, and the bid package was advertised. The bid opening was held on 5/1, and the apparent low bid was submitted by SAECO Electric and Utility. LNV reviewed the bid packages and finalized their recommendation. The item will be presented for final approval to Council on June 19, 2018.

- The Cades Cove water and sewer main replacement project was designed. The CDBG Agreement was presented to City Council and the bid package and plans were advertised. The pre-bid conference was 5/22, and the bid opening was 5/29. The apparent low bid was submitted by Gilbert's Utility and Concrete, Inc. The item will be presented to Council for final approval on June 19, 2018.
- O Year 1 street maintenance plans have been prepared and bids are to be advertised this month.
- The Evers Road bridge project is at the halfway mark! The gas main was relocated and the remaining concrete culverts are to be set and poured. The contractor will now start working several Saturdays, with an expected completion of mid-July.
- o The Huebner at Evers traffic signal project is 95% complete. The controller box was installed last week and we are waiting on CPS approval before converting the system.
- Set meeting with Consultant Nelisa Heddin to finalize options for water rates, in anticipation of bringing to City Council in July.
- Received quotes for the repair of the Forest Oaks pool deck and pump room anticipate construction the first three weeks of the pool being open.
- Received a Project Management Plan agreement from the United States Corp of Engineers for a Continuing Authorities Project (CAP) feasibility study of Huebner Creek to control flooding and repair bank erosion will take to Council on June 19th for final approval of a budget adjustment in the amount of \$285,000 to pay our 50% portion of the cost. The San Antonio River Authority will pay their 50% upon signing the agreements.
- The subcontractor for the LC-17 project will begin constructing water offsets for the El Verde Road water main. The water will be shut off one day this week to install the offsets. We will be notifying the residents on that street in advance.
- We will be trenching Forest View and Forest Grove streets for Oak Wilt prevention for the next two weeks. Affected residents will be notified of the trenching. Residents are encouraged to investigate injecting their Oak trees to prevent Oak Wilt.

Traffic officers attended court for eight (8) hours and one attended training for twenty-four (24) hours during the reporting period.

Training

- o Officer Breton attended First Line Supervisor course taught at the Live Oak Police Department.
- Corporal Farias attended the TASER electronic conductive device instructor re-certification course in Georgetown, Texas.
- Officer Azar attended the Drug Facility Sexual Assault Family Violence Strangulation Course through Police One.
- o Officer Breton completed a Family Violence investigation course through Police One.

Fire Department

- Inflatable Fire Safety House Arrives! The fire department took delivery of an inflatable fire safety house from the Boulder Blimp Co. out of Boulder Colorado. The "house" was obtained through a grant from the Firehouse Subs Foundation, which provided 100% funding (\$6,700). This new tool inflates in seconds and includes rooms, doors, and windows just like a real house. Firefighters will be able to walk groups of children and adults through the house, and teach the principals of fire safety.
- Shelter exercise success! Emergency Management Coordinator/Assistant Fire Chief Blake Wade was very successful in coordinating a shelter exercise with the Red Cross, NISD, regional Citizen Emergency Response Teams (CERT), and local citizens on June 9th. This was the most attended shelter

drill we have had in Leon Valley to date, and included over 50 people. Attendees learned the fundamentals of emergency shelter operations such as managing check-in, food service, setting up cots, and much more. The Red Cross continues to be the leader in emergency shelter management, and we are working to keep regular/coordinated training in Leon Valley.

- Structure Fire In the Ridge of Leon Valley The fire department responded to a reported house fire in the Ridge of Leon Valley on June 10th. Firefighters arrived in just minutes and discovered heavy smoke coming from the home. The Fire Lieutenant directed the team to make an interior attack and search. Once inside, the team worked to extinguish one room fully-involved, and removed pets that unfortunately succumbed to the heavy smoke. Firefighters attempted CPR on the pets for several minutes, but were unable to revive them. Expect work in the area for some time as the family rebuilds, and keep them in your thoughts and prayers.
- New "Pets Inside" Stickers Available The department has obtained new window decals that help identify to Firefighters the homes with pets. These new decals will be displayed and made available soon...details to come on our Facebook, Nextdoor page and Enews. This initiative, along with the obtaining of pet oxygen masks through a grant are efforts to improve our service delivery.
- **Soap Box Derby** The Soap Box Derby is on track, and drivers have had two successful training days. Finishing touches are being done on Derby cars, and the overall plan for the event. This event includes 30 volunteers in various positions.

Community Development Department

- Zoning Code Revisions
 - Staff and the Zoning Commission continue to discuss revisions to the City's zoning code. At the upcoming meeting, the Commission will be discussing Procedures, including Administrative procedures (Staff), Legislative procedures (Zoning Commission and City Council), and Quasijudicial procedures (Board of Adjustment). Topics will also include Specific Use Permits (SUP) and the introduction of "Limited-Use" Permits, which are similar to SUP's, except that may be approved administratively.
 - June 26th......Procedures

 - September 25th......Development Standards
 - October 23th......Non-Conformance

Zoning Cases

- o The next Zoning Commission meeting is scheduled for June 26, 2018, at 7:00 pm.
- o The Department has an open Zone Change and Specific Use Permit request for 7317 Huebner Road to facilitate the expansion of the St. John's Baptist Church. The applications are currently on-hold, due to the Zoning code requirement to submit a Level 1 Traffic Impact Analysis.
- A Master Sign Plan request has been submitted by Keller Sign Company, to allow for a minor expansion of existing freestanding signage at the HEB Market place shopping center. This request is scheduled for the June 26th Zoning Commission meeting.
- A minor code revision is also scheduled for the June 26th Zoning Commission meeting. The revision will remove the Code requirement to hold Commission meetings at 7:00, in order to provide more flexibility in potential meeting times.

• Board of Adjustment

The next Board of Adjustment meeting is tentatively scheduled for June 28th, 2018. This meeting was tentatively scheduled due to an influx of inquiries for potential variances and appeals. To date however, no applications have been received.

Plats

 Staff has an open replat request by Huebner Dirt Investments Ltd. for 2.418 acres located on Huebner Road. The replat would potentially create 3 lots. The land is undeveloped and is currently zoned B-1 and B-2. The applicant plans to request a rezoning of the property and has postponed his plat application until that time. An SUP will also be required for new commercial development on the site because it is adjacent to residential zoning.

• City Council

- The City Council is scheduled to consider the Master Sign Plan request submitted by Keller Sign Company, following consideration and recommendation by the Zoning Commission.
- Hike and Bike Trail Committee/Parks Committee
 - A joint Hike and Bike Trail and Parks Committee meeting is scheduled for July 12th, 2018, at 6:30 pm.

ONIT

Staff continues to work with the On-It team to resolve zoning, code enforcement, and certificate
of occupancy issues throughout the City. Staff provides support to Code Enforcement Officers
conducting research, preparing notices of violation, and initiating zoning and variance requests.

Permitting And Records

- o 68 walk-in customers were served from May 30, 2018, to June 13, 2018.
- o 51 permits were processed or are in progress.
- o 4 Certificates of Occupancy were issued.
- o 1 commercial building permit (new construction, additions, renovations) were issued.
- o The majority of permits issued were Contractor Registration and trade permits (MEP).

• Development Meetings/Correspondence

- O Staff coordinated with several residents regarding questions about fence permits. To receive a permit for a fence permit, a site plan is required. A survey is also required if the original stakes installed at the time of platting, are not present or visible for City inspectors during inspection.
- The Wei-Kee restaurant, formerly China Bowl, removed the existing non-conforming pole sign at their property on June 13th. This removal was required per the City's Sustainability Overlay District Standards, which intends to promote enhanced, lower-scale, monument signage along the Bandera Road Corridor.
- O Build Your Own Parts, 6610 Bandera Road, informed the City they will be removing the poles in their parking lot that are remnants of a previous pole sign.
- Staff continues coordination with the owners of the Crystal Lakes Shopping Mall. They are
 planning for infill development on the site which will include a new 9,000 square foot office
 building and enhanced landscaping at the northwest corner of Wurzbach and Watercress Roads.
- Staff further coordinated with the project architects for the LA Fitness Center proposed in the HEB Market Place Shopping Center. They have a prototype façade for all LA Fitness developments that does not conform to the City's Sustainability Overlay District Standards. The intent of the Code is to limit "brand" specific facades such as Circuit City's or Best Buy's which can limit future adaptability of a building and contribute to urban blight. They stated they may appeal Staff's interpretation of the design standards of the code.
- Staff met with management of the San Antonio Aquarium regarding required landscaping for the proposed expansion of their facility. Landscaping items will include street trees, parking lot trees, and parking lot buffering along Bandera Road.

• Development Process

- o Staff continues work streamlining the City's overall development review process, including:
- o The introduction of "Package Permits" which will consolidate all permits associated with a single project, into one consolidated "global" review process.
- The assignment of a permit liaison for all building permits, to help guide the City's customers through the permitting process.
- The updating of all permit applications to include checklists for applicants and Staff.
- o Creation of a deadline schedule to assist customers in project planning.

Economic Development

- The Economic/Community Development Advisory Group met May 30, 2018, and recommended approval of funding business breakfasts in coordination with UTSA's Small Business Development Department. This will be presented at the June 19, 2018 City Council Meeting.
- The Economic/Community Development Advisory Group will give their annual report to the Leon Valley City Council on June 19th, 2018.
- Staff is working with Quik Trip with the permitting process in anticipation of this store opening in October of 2018.
- Staff is working with the owner of the Rios Crystal Mall as they continue to construct an area for a new dollar store.
- Staff (led by City Secretary) continues to work on 4th of July activities and sponsors.
- Staff is working on developing a marketing sheet to present at the breakfast meetings and other potential opportunities.
- Old Lack's Furniture Building will be filled with a new business in the very near future staff assisting with this economic development project.

City Secretary

- Since the last report, the City Secretary's Office has processed 16 open record requests. Those requests were for: permit information, Red Light Camera items, planning/platting site plans, Staff emails, staff text messages, staff phone records, body cam videos, various historical ordinances, training manuals, oath of office information, and court records.

- City Council minutes, publication of recently adopted ordinances and agendas.
