#### **Human Resources**

• Vacant Positions

 Eight Firefighter Paramedics; currently advertising. City decided against hiring only a fire fighter or a paramedic but continuing with the tradition of requiring both credentials.

One receptionist; person in background.

#### **Public Works**

- Projects:
  - The contractor for the Cades Cove project is finishing up by working on the mill and overlay of asphalt.
  - Clark Construction has started the mill and overlay of Stirrup Lane, Stirrup Circle, and Forest Pine, as well as a seal coat on numerous other streets, intends to start construction this week.
     They are replacing non-ADA curb ramps this week.
  - o RCO Construction will start on the Bluebird water main extension this week. Once the water main is complete, they will start on the Poss Rd sewer main replacement.
  - The Evers Road bridge project is just about complete. The contractor finished up the limestone caps on the ends of the bridge, the plaque for Marine Lt. Corporal Perez was installed, and the contractor is waiting on the creek to dry up before installing the hydro-mulch to the banks of the creek. Other minor punch list items are being performed. The parking areas at the library and Conference Center were seal coated.
  - o The subcontractor for the LC-17 project is still working on the box culverts under El Verde.
  - Land clearing for the new sewer main extension at 7520 Huebner Road has begun. The
    contractor on Cades Cove will be the contractor installing the main, with help from the Public
    Works Crew; however, the site is still too wet to work.
  - o Work on The Ridge at Leon Valley Park walking path is in progress. The remaining area in this new park is being cleared in order to make room for the planned improvements.
  - Staff is working on bid documents for the rehabilitation of the Grass Hill above ground water storage tank and the Year 2 Street Maintenance Program.
  - o The City Engineer is working on plans for the bio-swale to be installed at Raymond Rimkus Park Forest Meadow entrance. The project will be let for bidding.
  - Working on creation of bid documents for Shadow Mist Park parking lot materials. Once received, the LC-17 contractor will install – expected date is end of January.

- The Assistant Director received a grant from AACOG in the amount of \$20,000 for new recycling kiosks for the parks and we are in the process of ordering the kiosks.
- o The Assistant Director will be attending the Certified Flood Plain Management continuing education class on November 29th.
- We are scheduling a forklift class for crews so they will properly and safely operate the new forklift.
- We will be scheduling the final backhoe training class in December for the crew who took the first portion last fiscal year.

- Blue Santa- FD teamed up with PD on 11/23/18 to collect funds to be used to purchase toys for Blue Santa. FD will proudly be assisting PD again on Friday 11/30/18 from 2-6 pm as we fill the boot to collect funds to continue to support Blue Santa.
- Holiday Event Sandy and Lisa are planning the holiday event for all Leon Valley employees and City Council being held on Thursday, December 13 from 11:30am 1:30pm. This consists of preparing food, games, prizes, etc.
- Census 2020 Lisa Martin and Sandy Underwood met with Richard Castanon, U.S. Census Bureau to plan and implement locally-based outreach campaign for the City of Leon Valley to prepare our city for a complete and accurate count by generating participation. This consists of creating a resolution, press release as well as a Community Census Committee to ensure a great representation (Business, Religious Groups, Education, 2 residents, Seniors, Chamber of Commerce Member, and Leon Valley Staff). The campaign will be completed by way of digital access, social media, events, local resources, business/corporations/foundations.

# **Community Development Department**

- Zoning Code/Comprehensive Plan Revisions
  - The Zoning Commission has also held meetings in September and October to discuss revisions to the City's zoning code. Those meetings focused on discussing mixed-use and redevelopment, particularly along the Bandera Road Corridor. However, the current comprehensive plan and future land use plan (which is a component of the Comprehensive Plan) do not go into a lot of detail on these topics; particularly on Bandera Road.
  - The Comprehensive Plan is a policy document, created by the community that guides among many things, the formulation/implementation of zoning. So it's important that discussion regarding mixed-use, redevelopment, and infill occur at a comprehensive planning and community level first, before the zoning code revision process continues. Meetings to discuss potential updates/revisions to the Comprehensive Plan will begin following the New Year.

  - An amendment to Article 15.02, Zoning Ordinance of the City of Leon Valley Code of Ordinances, regarding institutional uses including churches, museums, Libraries, schools, clubs, and lodges, in the B-1, B-2, and B-3 zoning districts.
  - A request for an amendment to the future land use plan of the City's Comprehensive plan regarding the property generally located at 6800 Evers Road.
  - Zone Change request from R-1 & B-2, to B-3 for approximately 9 acres at 6800 Evers Road (St. John's Baptist Church).
  - Request for a Specific Use Permit for a Church at 6800 Evers Road (St. John's Baptist Church).
  - A Replat and Subdivision Plat for the Timberhill Apartments; generally located south of Grissom Road, east of Timber Hill Drive.

#### • Board of Adjustment

o There are currently no future Board of Adjustment meetings scheduled.

#### Plats

- O Staff has an open replat request by Huebner Dirt Investments Ltd. for 2.418 acres located on Huebner Road. The replat would potentially create 3 lots. The land is undeveloped and is currently zoned B-1 and B-2. The applicant plans to request a rezoning of the property and has postponed his plat application until that time. An SUP will also be required for new commercial development on the site because it is adjacent to residential zoning.
- Staff is anticipating the submittal of a replat or a vacating plat request for the easement located just west of the termination of Huebner Road, in the Old Mill Subdivision. The owner of the easement is hoping to replat the easement as public right of way to provide access to the 18 acre tract to the west, so it can be developed for single-family residential lots.
- Staff is reviewing an Amending Plat for the property currently developed as the Leon Valley Storage. An amending plat is necessary to reconfigure existing lots to allow for new buildings on the property.
