Human Resources

Vacant Positions

o Maintenance Foreman; backgrounds being completed.

- o Maintenance Crewman; positons have been filled.
- o Planning & Zoning Director; position being advertised.

Public Works

- Projects:
 - Wrapping up water well project at Huebner well site. The well has been flushed and tested for safety this week, and is now in operation. Several minor punch list items are being completed.
 - Plans are finalized for a new traffic signal system at Wurzbach and Exchange Parkway, and will
 now be sent to the Purchasing Agent for advertisement and bids. Will work with CPS to
 coordinate site work.
 - o Cades Cove water and sewer main replacement project is being designed. Bids will be advertised and the results taken to Council in February for a March construction start date.
 - Year 1 street maintenance plans have been prepared and bids are to be advertised this month for a March start date (weather permitting).
 - o The Evers Road bridge project is underway and the old crossing has been removed. Badeco, the utility contractor, has started construction of the new gas mains. When they are ready to connect, they will shut off the valves at Wurzbach and Evers and on Poss at Bandera. There may be a strong odor of gas when that happens, but we will let everyone know closer to the date.
 - o The Huebner at Evers traffic signal project has begun. The work is expected to take approximately one month to complete.
 - Working with Consultant Nelissa Heddin to review water rates and revenues over the past two years.
- Working on Operations Manual for Public Works. We have assigned one crew member from each crew to attend focus group meetings and we will be meeting every Friday afternoon until completion.
- Working with contractor for LC-17 to keep residents informed of progress. The contractor is in the process of constructing sewer mains. Once that is complete, they will install the new water main.
- Getting quotes for capping the water well at 6530 Samaritan Drive the first quote was \$16,000. Staff contacted the Edwards Aquifer Authority to see if a grant was available to perform this work; however, they are only able to help with videotaping the column. We will now ask the EPA is they can help, as

the well is close to the plume area. The home has been found to contain asbestos, so quotes will be collected for abatement. Once the abatement has been performed, the Police Department will perform some tactical training at the home, then the home will be turned over to the Fire Department for fire practice, and finally, Public Works will clean up the lot.

• Fence contractor for Old Mill Park will start work this week to replace all the backyard fences around the perimeter of the park.

- Code Enforcement/Animal Control
 - O During this time period, Code Compliance tagged and followed up on thirty-nine (39) junked/abandoned vehicles. We removed over a hundred and fifty hundred (150) bandit signs,

- fifteen (15) calls for trash and high weeds, and handled one (1) graffiti cases which have been painted over by the city or property management.
- O Animal Control responded to a total of 41 calls for service. (1) feral cat was quarantined after a bite. In addition, (5) dogs returned to their owners with a warning on violating the City ordinance on restraining their pets. (1) resident was warned for insufficient food and water supply for a pet dog. The team picked up (2) dead cats, (1) dead deer, and (2) dead skunks for disposal. They also made calls for (6) missing dogs, and had (15) felines trapped and released after being neutered. (3) traps were dropped off as part of the TNR program.

Community Service

- Cpl. Mandry and Officer Espinoza attended Coffee for Cops 2/14/18 and conducted a Bike Rodeo at Carlos Coon Elementary School on 2/16/18
- Detective Brooks continued to work with the Texas Special Olympics for several upcoming events.
- Sergeant Urdiales and Detective Brooks gave five safety and crime prevention presentations to area churches.

Fire Department

- **Fire Recovery Activated!** Following the approval by City Council regarding Fire Recovery, the department has coordinated with the service provider, and has officially activated the process. The department has already processed 15 vehicle accidents since the ordinance was approved, and we are looking forward to reporting on the process.
- **ASPP Time!** The department is engaged in applying (again) for funding through the federal Ambulance Supplemental Payment Program (ASPP). This funding opportunity provides reimbursement for applicable emergency medical services to qualified agencies. The City of Leon Valley has recovered over \$250,000 since participating in this program, and are one of a very few EMS agencies that have worked to meet approval in the state of Texas. We are working hard to meet all the requirements, and hoping for a positive report.
- AACOG grant application The department has applied for an emergency management grant to replace the generator at the fire station through AACOG. Leon Valley was one of 2 suburban cities to apply for this local grant. There were 2.6 million in project applications, and only 1.5 million in funding. This grant is a 0% match, and the department will know in the coming weeks if this project will be funded.
- EMS Quality Assurance The department is engaged in updating a Quality Assurance/Insurance program, specifically with EMS services. As the Medical Director, Dr. Manifold is actively working to review our Paramedic patient care reports, and providing feedback, along with supporting any training needs, or changes to equipment or policies. EMS services continue to provide excellent services, the department is simply working to meet best practices.
- **Fire Code** The department led a local workshop initiative with area Fire Chiefs and Fire Marshals to review and develop consistent new amendments to the 2018 International Fire Code. The following cities participated and will be moving forward with a proposal to their respective jurisdictions; Live Oak, Balcones Heights, Castle Hills, Shavano Park, Kerrville, Guadalupe County, Universal City, and Leon Valley. This work will improve interoperability between jurisdictions, including firefighter safety. The new fire code is also needed to support our upcoming ISO survey.
- **Training** Fire Chief Valdez attended the Texas Fire Chiefs Association Executive Conference in Austin from February 26th, through 28th. Topics included; firefighter safety, leadership, dealing with line-of-duty death, active shooter training, cancer prevention, and how to engage in Texas legislation.

Community Development Department

• Zoning Cases and Code

- Staff continues making edits to the code, and proposes to bring code amendments to Zoning Commission in Spring 2018.
- A Zoning Commission meeting was held on February 27, 2018 at 6:30 p.m. No zoning case applications have been received, but the Zoning Commission held a discussion on the general rules for Commission members.
- Specific Use Permit No. 2017-281: a request from San Antonio Aquarium for the Construction and Operation of an "Entertainment Outdoor" Facility, in a B-3 (Commercial)
 Commercial/Industrial Overlay Zoning District, generally located at 6320 Bandera Road. The Zoning Commission heard the case on January 23, 2018 and recommended denial. A public hearing will be held before City Council on March 6, 2018.

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Board of Adjustment

Three cases have been received: No. 2018-218 – Applicant Courtyard Café requests a variance to allow a Pole Sign at 7600 Eckhert Rd, 2018-220-Applicant Javier Pompa requests a variance to allow for a carport in the back yard at 7303 LInkmeadow, and 2018-221 a request for a variance to the signs regulations at Valencia Lofts on Grissom Road, to install an artistic pole sign instead of a monument sign. The BOA will meet on March 15th.

OnIt

- Staff continues to work with the OnIt team to resolve zoning and code enforcement cases. Staff
 provides support to the Code Enforcement Officers conducting research and preparing notices of
 violation.
- Ocuncil held public hearing for 6643 Grist Mill on February 6, 2018, and declared the site a public nuisance and substandard building, and ordered demolition. On February 6, 2018, the property owner contacted staff via email and stated the property has been sold. Staff confirmed that the property has been sold.
- o Staff is continuing site visits with the Audit Team at the Northwest Industrial Park.
- Permitting & Records Management
 - o 120 customers were served from February 1 -26, 2018 at the Community Development Office.
 - o 14 Commercial Code Letters and 21 Residential letters were processed
 - o 6 C of O's issued
 - o 136 Permits issued for the month

Development Meetings

O Director met with Kevin White of White-Conlee Builders, who submitted a tree preservation variance request. The proposed project is to construct apartments on a site located on Grissom Road. There was no quorum at the Tree Advisory Board meeting on February 12, and the meeting was rescheduled to February 26; however, the applicant had added another request, which was not posted, therefore another meeting will be held on Friday, March 2nd, to hear his case and make any recommendation. The variance requests are tentatively scheduled for the March 6 City Council meeting.
