CITY COUNCIL MEETING MOVED TO JUNE 18TH

This week I was informed that three council members had work and vacation conflicts and could not attend the June 21st regularly scheduled city council meeting. Rather than cancel the meeting outright, we moved the June 21st meeting to June 18th at 5:30 pm (after the all day city council retreat), so a quorum could be present.

By this action, we are able to approve four agenda items which were already discussed and agreed to be approved. Additionally, there is a time sensitive issue for council to consider an ordinance accepting an \$8,500 grant from the U.S. Department of Justice for bullet proof vests for our Leon Valley police officers. The necessary second reading will be at the July 12th meeting, which is before the deadline to accept the grant.

Several items planned for the June 21 agenda will be moved to the July 12th meeting, including the appointment of members to 8 city committees.
